Applicants for each Individual Award must:

- 1) Be currently enrolled as an undergraduate in a college or university program or about to enter such a program;
- 2) Maintain a minimum 3.0 grade point average verified by either an official or unofficial transcript;
- 3) Include a resume which indicates a strong interest and commitment to Middle Eastern culture and heritage and/or demonstrates a strong will to perform Community service;
- 4) Submit two letters of recommendation (must be sealed and signed across the back);
- 5) Discuss in 500 words or less how your current and future service to your community will have a positive impact on Middle Eastern culture and heritage in the USA.
- 6) Be of Middle Eastern descent
- 7) Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident living in NY or NJ.

The Awards for Community Service are presented to deserving candidates whose commitment to Community Service efforts reflects the mission and goals of the Salaam Club of NY. The Salaam Club Scholarship Committee will determine the strongest and most worthy applicants based on their fulfillment of all requirements. Several grants of \$1,000 are given annually to students who are actively involved in or plan to participate in Middle Eastern heritage and or community or public service projects. Examples of activities include volunteering in a non-profit organization, promoting support efforts that affect the lives of people in need, preparing for Foreign Service, clerking for a judge, running for office in school (HS or College), working in a soup kitchen, or specializing in public administration.
